That in the interests of improving safety for children travelling to and from school I fully support the amendment to speed limit bylaw. I'd like to emphasise that I feel it's particularly important that the variable 40kmh limit is implemented on Tahunanui Drive.

In addition to reducing speed around schools I submit that there is also an urgent need for a driver education programme to remind drivers to drive courteously and safely up to pedestrian crossings (with and without a patrol in place). I have personally witnessed (on more than one occaision) even the police driving marked vehicles ignoring pedestrians waiting to cross at the crossing patrol on Tahunanui Drive.

On behalf of the board, staff, children and their families of Rutherford Street Kindergarten, I would like to make a submission on the addition of Rutherford Street to Schedule M - Variable Speed Limits, Speed Limits Bylaw 2011 (210).

It is proposed that a 1.2km stretch of Waimea Road and Rutherford Street becomes a variable speed limit school zone. Rutherford Street Kindergarten is situated just 50m north of the proposed new zone and we propose that the school zone be extended to include our centre.

We currently have 45 preschool-aged children enrolled in our well established kindergarten. Due to the independent nature of the kindergarten, children and their families come from many different areas in Nelson to attend. Many families travel by car, quickly filling the car park we share with an adjacent church. There is always overflow and parents and their children must park along Rutherford Street, often on the opposite side of the road, and cross through heavy traffic. Several families who

walk also have to cross Rutherford Street to get to kindergarten.

The kindergarten session times are 8.30am to 12.30pm, and 12.30pm to 3.30pm.

At 8.30am and again at 3.30pm, parents, attending children and their school-aged siblings are entering and leaving the kindergarten at a time when traffic on Rutherford Street is particularly heavy.

At 12.30pm, the changeover of morning to afternoon sessions sees double the volume of enrolled children arriving and leaving the centre. This is a very busy time of the day with many children outside the kindergarten, and a large number of cars leaving and entering the traffic on Rutherford Street.

In addition, we are concerned that at any of these times, northbound vehicles will be coming out of the speed limit school zone on approach to the kindergarten and accelerating back up to 50kph.

We believe now is the time to see a reduction in the speed limit outside our kindergarten. Traffic is heavy around Nelson College for Girls at the start and end of the school day, and Rutherford Street and Waimea Road are becoming increasingly busier at peak times with traffic coming in and out of the city.

Road Safe Nelson Bays (Inc) is a group that fosters and promotes safety on our road network. Membership includes Nelson City Council and Tasman District Council, Police, Accident Compensation Commission, NZTA, Automobile Association, NZ Road Transport Association, Bicycle Nelson Bays, Motorcycle clubs, and the Nelson Marlborough District Health Board.

Road Safe Nelson Bays endorses the Nelson City Council Speed Limit Bylaw review and support all of the proposals for variable speed zones made. Please note however that Police will be providing separate feedback direct to council staff and abstained from discussion.

We have some further comments:

In relation to the Victory School zone – we applaud the extension of it to cater for children exiting onto Totara and St Vincent Street. We ask that Council consider further extension of the zone to include the intersection of Toi Toi Street and Vanguard Street where many children cross the road between the Hampden Street walkway and Victory Square. We acknowledge the recent addition of a purpose build refuge further north but many children still take the most direct route and cross at the intersection which is known to have a crash history. We understand that there are some rules about the distance these zones can operate from a school gate but request that an extension be made if at all possible.

We note that Auckland Point school frontage is not being considered for the variable speed zone and understand the reasons why. We ask that Council urgently consider some other treatment to make this school frontage more conspicuous to drivers and to improve the safety at the pedestrian crossing on Haven Road.

I believe that a 40km/h speed limit on Tahunanui Drive is necessary as Tahunanui School is one of the few schools that has entrances on two main roads. Albeit that Tahunanui Drive is classed as a state highway, it is more important than ever to reduce the speed limit to 40km/h at this school entrance as bigger trucks and vehicles pass this way to get to Nelson. There is a school crossing at this entrance and school children are often gaining access to the school here. A variable speed school zone limit be provided on the crossing of Tahunanui Drive outside Tahunanui School. I am caregiver to my 8 year old grand-daughter who now wishes to walk alone to school every day. A child of this age has difficulty judging speed AND distance. I have been knocked over by a car on this crossing as an adult. I think it extremely dangerous for children. Room 11 (Year 3 students) at Tahunanui School have heard that there is a great idea being looked at to put a slow zone on Tahunanui Drive. Some of us have to cross that road to get to school in the morning so we had a class discussion and thought we had some good suggestions to add to this topic.

First of all why **wouldn't** you choose to have a slow zone to keep kids safe? Is it really so important that adults get to work a couple of minutes faster? We aren't asking them to stop, just to slow down.

Secondly cars have less control going faster and it takes them longer to stop. If it's raining it will be more dangerous because the tyres will slide. If the drivers are not paying attention then they might be going too fast to stop safely for the crossing sign or children who are arriving early when the patrol isn't out, or after patrol has come in.

We also believe that it's unfair that children crossing on Muritai Street have a nice safe slow zone but on the other side (Tahunanui Drive) they don't.

A lower speed limit is also important because even though the speed limit is 50 some cars still go over the limit and speed so if we make it 40 maybe they will go 50. Some students **have** to cross Tahunanui Drive, they don't have a choice, but cars don't **have** to go so fast. If they are going over 40 and they hit us it will hurt us more.

Two of our classmates looked on the internet and found that in London slow zones made a huge difference to how serious crash injuries were compared to places that didn't have them.

Finally if we don't change this it is the students that will pay the price and the adults who had the chance to change it, and didn't, will feel really bad. We hope you listen to us. Please give us a nice safe slow zone!

Proposed 40km/h variable speed limits in schools zones

This letter is comment and support for the proposed variable speed limits currently before council. As there are a number of sites I have broken the letter down into headings relating to each site.

- 1. St Josephs School. The Police support this proposal as set out in the proposal document dated 29/04/2013, including the inclusion of streets in your proposal document that do not strictly meet the warrant criteria to maintain consistency. The placement of signage and traffic calming offer good warning to motorists and we are comfortable e with their proposed placement.
- 2. Nelson College for Girls. The Police support this proposal as set out in the proposal document dated 29/04/2013, with one major exception. As it is proposed Police object to the extension of this zone from the southern end of the school zone along Waimea Road to meet with Hampden Street School. In relation to the placement of signage and traffic calming for the rest of the area around this school Police believe it offers good warning to motorist and we are comfortable with their proposed placement.
 - **2.1.** It is Police belief that the inclusion of Waimea Road from the northern boundary of the park 'Little Wembley' as proposed is too removed from the school boundary to be effective.
 - **2.2.** The use of this park by the school has little impact on traffic as the frontage is almost completely fenced off from the road, with the differing heights of the park and the road adding to the conclusion that the park has no impact on the road.
 - **2.3.** Use of pupils, along this stretch of footpaths, to travel to all the local schools has no impact out of the norm and does not, in accordance with the guidelines set out in Traffic note 37, warrant inclusion in the variable speed zone.
 - 2.4. The variations on operating times at each of the schools proposed to be included in the combined zone would extend the timing of the zone as a whole beyond the norm, whereas if operated independently the impact on motorists using this main route would be minimised.
 - **2.5.** While a change in speed for a short distance may be raised as an issue and it can be a challenge to motorists, Police believe this can easily be understood and achieved by the average motorist.
 - **2.6.** Police can however see safety benefits in lower speed limits and accept that councils should be pro-actively encouraging lower speed limits where appropriate, such as around schools.

- 2.7. Police believe that to extend the area outside the Traffic note guideline zones without extensive traffic calming treatments would reduce compliance with the speed in this area, creating danger for pupils who could assume traffic would be travelling slower than it actually is.
- **2.8.** It would also degrade compliance in other school zones, in a similar manner that is commonly seen at poorly marked and vacant temporary speed zones at road works.
- **2.9.** Police would only consider approval of this extension along Waimea Road to join with Hampden Street school if there were located further reminder 'variable' signs, linked into the proposed signs, at a suitable location midday between 'Little Wembley' and Hampden street. It is noted that the proposal suggests fixed signage but police believe this is not a visible enough reminder.
- 3. Hampden Street School. The Police support this proposal as set out in the proposal document dated 29/04/2013, with one major exception. As it is proposed Police object to the extension of this zone from the southern end of the school along Waimea Road to meet with Nelson Girls College. In relation to the placement of signage and traffic calming for the rest of the area around this school Police believe it offers good warning to motorist and we are comfortable with their proposed placement.
 - 3.1. The reasons for this objection are set out in Paragraphs 2.1 through to 2.9.
- 4. Nelson Boys college. The Police support this proposal as set out in the proposal document dated 29/04/2013, with one major exception. As it is proposed Police object to the extension of this zone from the southern end of the Hampden street school along Waimea Road to meet with Nelson Girls College. In relation to the placement of signage and traffic calming for the rest of the area around this school Police believe it offers good warning to motorist and we are comfortable with their proposed placement.
 - 4.1. The reasons for this objection are set out in Paragraphs 2.1 through to 2.9.
- 5. **Nelson Intermediate.** The Police support this proposal as set out in the proposal document dated 29/04/2013, with one major exception. As it is proposed Police object to the extension of this zone from the Intersection of Motueka Street and Tipahi Street through to the southern end of the Victory school zone on Vanguard Street. Police believe it should end near the boundary of the school fields. In relation to the placement of signage and traffic calming for the rest of the area around this school Police believe it offers good warning to motorist and we are comfortable with their proposed placement.
 - **5.1.** It is Police belief that the inclusion of Motueka Street and part of Vanguard Street as proposed is too removed from the school boundary to be effective.
 - **5.2.** Use of pupils, along this stretch of footpaths, to travel to all the local schools has no impact out of the norm and does not, in accordance with the guidelines set out in Traffic note 37, warrant inclusion in the variable school speed zone.
 - **5.3.** Police can however see safety benefits in lower speed limits and accept that councils should be pro-actively encouraging lower speed limits where appropriate.
 - 5.4. Police believe that to extend the area outside the Traffic note guideline zones without extensive traffic calming treatments would reduce compliance with the speed in this area, creating danger for pupils who could assume traffic would be travelling slower than it actually is.

- **5.5.** It would also degrade compliance in other school zones, in a similar manner that is commonly seen at poorly marked and vacant temporary speed zones at road works.
- **5.6.** Police consider other traffic calming measures are undertaken in the stretch of road if there is a risk to the public. This could include active warning signs, built out or 'Pedestrian crossings'.
- 6. Victory School. The Police support this proposal as set out in the proposal document dated 29/04/2013. The placement of signage and traffic calming offer good warning to motorists and we are comfortable with their proposed placement.
- 7. Tahunanui School. The Police support this proposal as set out in the proposal document dated 29/04/2013. The placement of signage and traffic calming offer good warning to motorists and we are comfortable with their proposed placement.

Submission to Nelson City Council Speed Limit Bylaw review 2013

The mission of Bicycle Nelson Bays is to increase the numbers, activity and safety of cyclists in the Nelson region, with a particular focus on on- and off-road urban cycle routes.

Bicycle Nelson Bays endorses the Nelson City Council Amendment to Speed Limits Bylaw to add variable speed zones surrounding selected Nelson schools.

Research has shown that reducing speeds to 40km/hr or less reduces the level of injury if a child is struck by a vehicle. A concern about road safety is a major barrier to active transport to and from school. The aim of variable speed zones is to slow traffic around schools during school opening and closing times which will create a safer environment for children to walk and cycle to and from school.

Placement of signs

The variable speed zones will require many signs to be erected. It is very important that the placement of signs does not cause an obstruction to cyclists. If signs are placed on the part of the road where cyclists usually ride this will create a pinch point requiring cyclists to swerve into the main traffic flow. It is pleasing that almost all of the signs indicated on the plans are not obstructive to cyclists.

The plans indicate that the sign beside 36 Motueka St will be placed on the road so is a potential obstruction for cyclists. We suggest other options for placement of this sign are considered, though we do acknowledge that the hedge and narrow footpath beside the sign do limit potential places.

Victory School Zone

We suggest that the Victory School zone is extended to include the intersection of Toi Toi Street and Vanguard St where many primary and college students cross the road between the Hampden St walkway and Victory Square. If possible, we'd also like the recently added cycle/pedestrian crossing point which is a short distance North the Toi Toi St. junction on Vanguard St. to be considered for inclusion within the zone. We understand that the junction and crossing point are beyond the standard 250m from the school however the junction and crossing point are well used by school children and traffic speeds are still high through this area. Additionally, the crossing point has been

identified as a preferred route for children cycling to Nelson Intermediate school.
